The Shoeburyness High School Shield

In 2007, this shield was presented to the Southend Musical Festival by Shoeburyness High School, as part of the outreach curriculum.

The school is committed to encouraging students of all ages to participate in musical activities. Within the school, this has included students attending musical instrument lessons and various ensembles.

Over the last few years, initiatives in this area have caused the number and standard of pupils involved in music within the school to improve greatly.

Outside of school time, the students at Shoeburyness High School have run workshops for pupils of local primary schools, staff from the school have worked with local primary schools on music lessons, and a wind orchestra has been started, as part of the extended schools programme, to which students of all ages have been invited.

In order to further encourage achievement in music at all ages, the school has donated a shield as the prize in the School Orchestra 18 years and under category.

The Eileen Greaves Trophy for Family Class

Eileen Greaves, former Secretary and advisor to the Festival, died on 12th March 2002, at the age of 89. Everyone connected with the Southend Musical Festival will recall and appreciate the valuable contribution she made. From 1982-1993, Eileen held the position of General Secretary. In this capacity, she successfully encompassed all aspects of the organisation. With her great energy and application and understanding of the artistic needs of the Festival, she worked steadfastly throughout her twelve years of tenure. As a solo performer in the Singing Section, she was very successful. Although she came to discover her excellent singing voice later in life than many singers, she enjoyed a great success as a competitor, winning many prestigious awards, including the Premier Trophy. Important amongst the many interests in her life was choral singing. She particularly loved the last night of the Festival during the period when there were large numbers of choirs competing in an atmosphere of great excitement and first-rate performances. Eileen also took over the Jesse Ladies' Choir, which she conducted for some years. Choral Verse Speaking, a very charming Speech & Drama class, was also supported by Eileen as a competitor, in this case as a member of the "Focus Ladies" group. Another great love was for Dickens' writing. As well as taking part, very successfully, in the Senior Dickens class at the Festival, Eileen was driving force behind the Southend Dickens Fellowship. Eileen also contributed two very handsome trophies: The Eileen Greaves Challenge Cup for the Oratorio Class and the Eileen Greaves Trophy for the Family Class. The Festival was very well served by Eileen, and she will be remembered with gratitude and affection.
